Keyth Kahrs June 1 through June 30



Keyth Kahrs of Salisbury will be showing his art in the lobby of the Agri-Civic Center during the month of June.

Keyth is a representational artist who works in acrylics and transparent watercolor. His subject matter is varied, and in many instances features water, dramatic light with shadow and reflections. Landscapes are his favorite subject; although he has painted pet portraits, figure studies, automobiles and motorcycles. With a background and education in graphic design, it is clear to see how this exerience has influenced his work. His paintings are often times sharp and vivid, with special attention paid to contrast and composition. His work has been

described as California Super Realism, a term that he embraces with enthusiasm.

Kahrs most recently owned and operated Leaping Trout Studio in Paducah Kentucky's Historic Lower Town Arts District, where he began pursuing his fine arts full-time. He continues to develop his technical skills, and nurture his trademark style or personal imprint. As he puts it: "It's a continuing work in progress."

These days Keyth is traveling throughout the beautiful state of North Carolina, taking photographs, and making sketches of scenes discovered during his travels - later to be captured on canvas or paper for public display and sale. Have you ever wondered who thought up the idea of kaleidoscopes or how to create one? Come along



on a journey with kaleidoscope artist Sue Davis to learn more about how tiny bits of color can be reflected into ever changing designs. At the end of the journey, each student will have created a kaleidoscope using a wand, front surface mirror systems and an aluminum body. This class is the one with training wheels. If you like what you create, the world of kaleidoscopes will open to you. To personalize the design on the outside of the kaleidoscope you may bring a photograph, a drawing or picture of your favorite thing. You may bring a collection of small pieces or one large piece that is no larger than 8 inches square; we will cut it to fit the tube.

Minimum: 3 participants, Maximum: 8. Age Limit 18 and Up


Cost: \$60.00

Do you like working with natural materials and letting your creativity out? In this three hour class you will create a unique one of a kind basket made with kudzu and other natural materials using different weaving

techniques. Prior basket experience not necessary, moderate hand strength and a good pair of clippers are needed. The kudzu and other weaving materials will be provided.

The baskets that we will be making are call garden baskets. They can be used in lots of different ways. They can hold fruit, guest soap and wash cloth, flower girl basket, etc...



Pamela Buchanan is an artisan who designs unique one of a kind basket's and other creations using kudzu along with other natural materials locally harvested and processed. She has been working with natural materials since taking her first class in 1996 at Chimney Rock Park. Over the years Pamela has honed her craft while taking class at John C. Campbell, River Oaks Studio in Asheville NC, as well as, assisting in other workshops. Pamela gathers her materials in and around the Piedmont of North Carolina which include kudzu, honeysuckle, grapevine, bittersweet, willow, mimosa bark, tulip poplar bark and river birch. Pamela enjoys working with people and one of her biggest joys is watching others make their own unique baskets and other creations when conducting classes.
